Coultis & Son \$59.80 for plank; Chris Borthwick \$20.54 for plank, stringers and work on bridge con. 2, and \$37, grading etc., con. 2; G. W. Dowd \$45.50 for gravel; Jas. Laird \$15.25, for tile on 27 s. r.; Geo. Borthwick \$2.21, supplies for E. Gerouard; Rich. Moore \$461.60, building bridge over Shawana drain 9 s. r., and \$336.60, building bridge over Russell drain 9 s. r.; D. K. Stewart \$52, drawing gravel and stone for bridges 9 s. r. & P. L.; Forest Free Press \$2.70, ad for tenders Haney drain, and \$2.40 ad. re Court of Revision; Forest Standard \$1, ad Court of Revision; A. Weir \$17, advice; Earl Stewardson \$1.50, work in gravel pit; Wm. Bright \$3, for tile con. 8; Burr and Russell \$1.50, work on Haney drain; Geo. 
