Besides these there are: One BIRNEY Exhibition (\$50); Three STEVENSON Science Scholarships (\$40); One MCCAWLEY Hebrew Prize (\$38); One COGSWELL Scholarship (\$120), open for Candidates for Holy Orders; One MCCAWLEY Testimonial Scholarship (\$38); One AKINS' Historical Prize (\$30); One ALMON-WELSFORD Testimonial (\$24); One HALIBURTON Prize (\$20); One COGSWELL Cricket prize. The necessary expenses of Board, Rooms, &c., average \$25 per annum. Nominated students do not pay tuition fees. These nominations are in number, are open to all Matriculated Students, and are worth about \$90 for the three years course. All Matriculated Students are required to reside in College unless specially exempted. The Professor's reside within the limits of the University grounds.
