## Glen Clark Premier of British Columbia

Glen Clark has lived all his life in East Vancouver where he has worked in the labour movement and as a natural resource policy consultant. He has a bachelor of arts degree from Simon Fraser University and a master's degree in community and regional planning from the University of British Columbia.

First elected to the provincial legislature in 1986, Mr. Clark represents the riding of Vancouver-Kingsway. He has served as Minister of Finance and Corporate Relations and as Minister of Employment and Investment. In the latter portfolio, he was responsible for major Crown corporations, including B.C. Hydro, B.C. Transit, B.C. Ferries and B.C. Buildings.

Mr. Clark was sworn in as British Columbia's 31st Premier on Feb. 22, 1996. He formed his second cabinet on June 17, 1996, following the May 28 election.

Mr. Clark and his wife, Dale, have two children.
