APPOINTMENT OF MEMBERS
AND CANDIDATES

Question No. 155—**Mr. Reid:**

What are the names of all individuals who had been Members of Parliament or who were federal candidates in the elections of 1957, 1958, 1962 or 1963 and who were appointed to the Senate, the Bench, any federal government Board, Commission, Agency, Enquiry, Study or Advisory Group or to any Civil Service position or who were employed in any capacity by the Government of Canada, giving (a) the position to which each was appointed (b) the date of any such appointment and the duration of the appointment (c) the amount paid to each such individual in each year, for all purposes, including salary, expenses and allowances?

Mr. Yves Forest (Parliamentary Secretary to President of the Privy Council): Since persons appointed to the Senate, the bench, federal boards, commissions, agencies, etc. are not required to declare whether or not they have ever been candidates in federal elections, there is no record under the administrative responsibility of the government of Canada from which an answer to this question can be drawn.

ORIGIN OF C.B.C. PROGRAMS

Question No. 178—**Mr. McCleave:**

1. Which programs to be shown on the national television network of the C.B.C. this fall and winter originate from: Toronto, Montreal, Winnipeg, Ottawa, Halifax, Vancouver, St. John's and other centres?

2. Is consideration being given to the origination of more of such national programs from centres

other than Toronto or Montreal and, if so, with what expected result?

Hon. Gérard Pelletier (Secretary of State): I am informed by the C.B.C. as follows: 1. The attached list reflects the prominence of Toronto as the English T.V. network headquarters and main network origination point. However, it must be taken into account that many program items not apparent from a listing of program titles are contributed by other centres. Also, many regionally produced programs are exchanged among regions for local scheduling on C.B.C. stations in non-network time periods.

2. Yes. The corporation is seeking ways to increase regional contributions to the network to effect an improvement in the flow and exchange of cultural and regional information and entertainment between the different parts of Canada.
