NOTICES OF MOTIONS.

For Friday, 2nd March, 1900.

By the Honourable Mr. Perley :—

- 1 February 6—That he will ask the Government, how many train-loads of cattle has been shipped from Montreal, via the Drummond County Railway and the Intercolonial Railway, to St. John, N.B.? Also, how many bushels of wheat have been shipped over the Drummond County Railway from Montreal, via Intercolonial Railway, to St. John, N.B.? Also, how many vessels have loaded cattle and grain at the Government terminus of the Intercolonial Railway at St. John, N.B.? And also, how many bushels of grain is in the elevator for shipment at the terminus of the Intercolonial Railway? And if any, where did it come from?

By the Honourable Mr. Ferguson :—

- 2 February 9—That he will inquire of the Government :—
1. Whether a contract for grading a section of the railway from Charlottetown to Murray Harbour, P.E.I., for which tenders were called in November last, has been awarded?
 2. If so, to whom, what is the mileage of the said section, and the contract price per mile?
 3. When is the work to be commenced, and when completed?
