that is palatable for a good many miles afterwards. Leaving Portneuf, roads begin to get very hard with clay lumps, making very slow wheeling to St. Bazile, and getting rocky and very "hilly" towards Point Rouge. Up to this point the land has been very level, but steep hills where "walking is good" will be encountered from here to Quebec. Macadam roads continue from Pt. Rouge to Belair, a distance of 15 miles, the longest distance between any of the The roads then incline to clay passing through Lorette and getting better towards Quebec. Of course these clay roads were passed over on dry days; when it rains — — . This journey was performed by Mr. Louis Rubenstein, of the Montreal Bicycle Club, who was accompanied by Mr. J. H.
