## BILL J<sup>8</sup>.

## An Act for the relief of Hubert Allan Frise.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Hubert Allan Frise, domiciled in Canada and residing at the town of Simcoe, in the province of Ontario, high school teacher, has by his petition alleged that on the third day of March, A.D. 1924, at the city of Port Arthur, in the said province, he and June Odel Lang, 5 who was then of the city of Fort William, in the said province, a spinster, were married; and whereas by his petition he has prayed that, because of her adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it 10 is expedient that the prayer of his petition be granted: Therefore His Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Marriage dissolved. **1.** The said marriage between Hubert Allan Frise and 15 June Odel Lang, his wife, is hereby dissolved, and shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.

Right to marry again. 2. The said Hubert Allan Frise may at any time hereafter marry any woman whom he might lawfully marry if 20 the said marriage with the said June Odel Lang had not been solemnized.
