BETHLEHEM STEEL PASSES RECORDS

NEW YORK, Oct. 3.—Today's session at the stock exchange furnished a fitting close to one of the most active weeks in the history of that institution. At the outset there were signs that the movement in the specialties had run its course, temporarily, at least, but before the end of the first hour heavy trading was again in full swing. The second hour was even more active, the short market recording a turnover of about 10,000 shares.

OVERCROWDING ON ST. LAWRENCE YET

Wagon Section Too Small to Handle Business and Some Stay Out. NOT MANY POTATOES Continued Wet Weather Has Had Bad Effect Upon Ontario Crop.

Notwithstanding the fact that it rained heavily last night, making the country roads very bad, the farmers and market gardeners are expected to go to the section of the St. Lawrence Market Saturday—quite a few wagons having to line the street. Get busy Mr. Commissioner and solve the overcrowding problem.

Potatoes were noted for their absence; most of the crops having been ruined by the excessive wet weather. The few necessary vegetables have again advanced on the wholesale, selling at \$1.15 per bag on Saturday, an advance from 35c to 45c per bag in a little over a week, and they are expected to go still higher; some of the authorities expect they will reach the \$2 per bag mark very shortly.

The various other vegetables were brought in in large quantities and with the exception of cauliflower, which is a failure this year, were of good quality. Cauliflower, however, is a failure again, having some splendid quality but being mostly rotten. Cauliflower, which sold readily at 15c per small measure, 30c per six-quart basket, and 80c per 12-quart basket.

Chickens literally flooded the market, and the large number sold singly and by the pair, brought 25c per lb., the bulk of which was sold at 15c and 17c per lb., and were still a lot unsold, which meant that the market would be glutted with 15c per lb. before closing. Ducks brought about the same prices as the chickens, while spring turkeys sold at 30c per lb. wholesale. The first geese of the season appeared on Saturday, selling at about 18c per lb.

Wholesale Fruit and Vegetable Market: The wholesale fruit market was quite active early on Saturday, but later became quiet and inactive, and was absolutely dead in the afternoon. The fruits were mostly sold in lots, and a few morning buyers, and as a consequence quite a number were left unsold. Peaches brought from 20c to 40c for 11-quart flat baskets, and from 40c to 75c for 12-quart flat baskets. Apples were scarce, and only ordinary varieties were shipped in, bringing from 15c to 20c per bushel; a few slightly better quality bringing 40c per bushel. There were not any varieties on the market Saturday. There were quite a number of choice tomatoes shipped in on Saturday, the market for baskets bringing from 25c
