R O C K A M A T I O N.

WHEREAS the Deputies of the *Senators*, at a Treaty lately held at *Philadelphia*, complained to me, in Behalf of the *Six United Nations*, That, contrary to the Tenor of a former Treaty, now subsisting, between them and the said Province, and without their Consent, divers Persons, Inhabitants of this Province, having Lives and Families on Lands not purchased of them, lying Westward of the said Province, did much to their Hurt; and earnestly pray'd, that they should be forthwith prevented the bad Consequences that might otherwise ensue. And further, That no Persons have neither Licence from the Proprietaries, nor Colour of Title to the Land to permit them to remain there, would not only be a Breach of the Pacts
