R E A S the Deputies of the *Savannah*, at a Treaty lately held at *Powhatan*,
complained to me, in Behalf of the *Six United Nations*, That, contra-
ry to the Tenor of a former Treaty, now subsisting, between them and the
Province, and without their Consent, divers Persons, Inhabitants of this Province, have
settled themselves and Families on Lands not purchased of them, lying Wellward of the
River, much to their Hurt; and earnestly pray'd, that they should be forthwith
removed, to prevent the bad Consequences that might otherwise ensue. And that
the same Persons have neither Licence from the Proprietaries, nor Colour of Title to the
Land, and to permit them to remain there, would not only be a Breach of the Pro-
