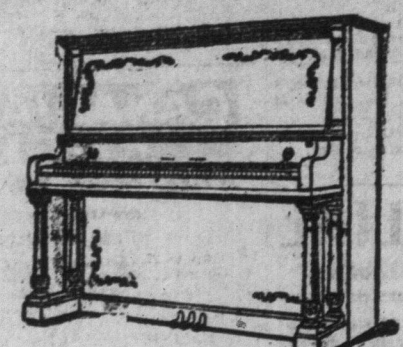

Conviction of Officers of St. Catharines Union for Depriving Man of Work is Quashed.

The court of appeal at Osgoode Hall yesterday gave decisions in three out of six important criminal cases. The conviction of Marshall Harman, who was tried at Whitby in September, 1904, with the death of his wife, but who is now out on suspended sentence. It was alleged that he had neglected to provide his wife with the medical attendance and necessities, whereby her life might have been prolonged. Local Canadian Club and the Affairs of Olive Life.

President Pencock of the Canadian Club was asked yesterday regarding Earl Grey's suggestion that such institutions as the Canadian Club might strive for the protection of city life against boggling, theft and graft. He had just read the remarks of the governor-general at Winnipeg, and declined to offer an opinion as to what the policy of the club should be along such lines.

"If we continue in our usual course," said he, "we will not commit ourselves to any particular question."

"The Canadian Club may have an indirect influence upon such evils by the betterment of its members and indirectly the public by the educational aspect of the club, which is strictly non-partisan."

J. J. WARREN IS CHOSEN.

Succeeds to Management of Trusts and Guarantee Co.

The board of directors of the Trusts and Guarantee Company, Limited, yesterday elected James J. Warren as managing director, in the place of the late T. P. Coffey.

Mr. Warren is a barrister and solicitor. He was called to the bar on Feb. 1, 1892, and secured the bronze medal of the Law Society at that time. On completing his course as a student, Mr. Warren became partner in the firm of Watson, Thorne, Smoke & Masten. Subsequently he was a member of the firms of Thorne, Warren & Starr, and Masten, Warren, Starr & Spence. Since May 1901, Mr. Warren has practiced alone, with offices in the McKinnon building. He has devoted most of his attention to commercial and corporate law, and to investments for clients.

Mr. Warren is a native of Oshawa, and is thirty-five years of age.

KING ALFONSO'S SPEECH.

Presents to Cortes Government's Projects for Reform.

Madrid, Oct. 11.—The royal message to parliament, which King Alfonso read before the chamber of deputies today, presented the government's projects for electoral, judicial and police reform, the organization of workmen's pensions, modifications of the liquor laws, the administration of the Bank of Spain, revision of the code for military instruction, the construction of the new navy and the acquisition of war materials.

The message declared that the relations between Spain and the foreign powers were cordial and tended to the elaboration of the treaties of commerce, and referred to the Moroccan negotiations, in which Spain takes an active part, having adhered to the international conference for the purpose of settling contested questions between the powers.

FRESHIES LOSE THEIR SOCKS MEDS' HUSTLE WAS FIERCE

Over 300 Students Take Part in Annual Melee—No One Hurt, But—

The first and second year students of the Toronto Medical School yesterday participated in a right royal "melee" yesterday afternoon. There were about 300 mixed up in it and the classes were about evenly divided. There were no casualties and good feeling prevailed, although a number of the suits of clothes were soiled and one watch and chain was lost.

The onslaught upon the "freshies" was planned early in the morning by the "sophies." Shortly after 2 o'clock the second year men, clad in football togs, congregated near the door of the Biology building and "laid for 'em." A big bicycle rack was put across the door as a barrier and the freshmen were let out one by one, three or four men being detailed to each. At the door the freshmen were met by a line of sophomores, which blined them out of resistance. In a short time the freshmen were in a body and the real melee began. The freshmen were described by some of the older men to be the fiercest of the school has yet seen. The freshmen were lifted and banged around and their shoes and stockings taken off. When the row was over Prof. Ramsay Wright came out and took a number of names of the participants. A number of freshmen did not leave the class room, and it is said they will get what's coming to them later.

NORTHWEST BOOMS SARNIA.

Several Large Firms Have to Extend Buildings.

Sarnia, Oct. 11.—Sarnia is experiencing a boom in manufacturing, and all the larger plants here are preparing for larger business next year. The Imperial Oil Works are installing a system of conveyors to cost \$35,000 for handling coal cargoes. The Doherty Stove Works recently completed an extensive addition. The Goodson Thresher Company has this week commenced new buildings, which will almost double the plant.

The newly-established Empire Salt Works, which has been shipping 400 barrels daily, will engage in the manufacture of fine table salts. The Durant Cart Carriage Company, which recently located in Sarnia from Flint, Mich., will move to larger quarters.

The bulk of the new business is coming from the Northwest.
