Man Has Top of Shoulder Blown Off-Boy Has Skull Fractured by Fall From Horse.

HAMILTON, July 7 .- (Special.)-A heavy thunderstorm that blew up about 5 o'clock Saturday afternoon, did considerable damage. J. Harding's barn, in rear of Chadwick Bros.'. East Kingstreet, was struck by lightning and set on fire. The building was almost destroyed. The street car system was tied up for nearly two hours, and several hundred people who were at the Y.M.C.A. games at the half-mile track had to tramp all the way to the city. The Radial Railway, was also tied up, and no cars could be operated for a couple of hours. Many small boats were caught in the storm on the bay, and several capsized, but no one was
