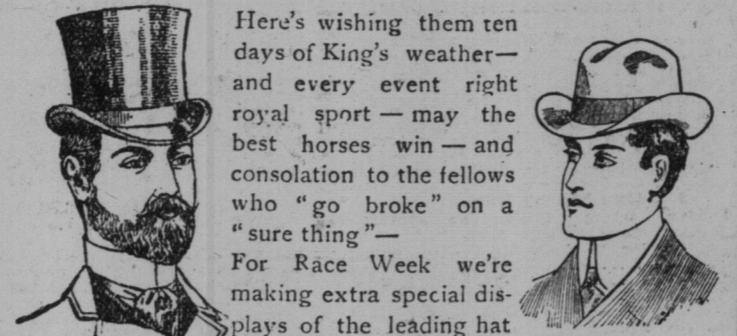
VICIOUS DOGS KILL A HEIFER.

Great American Quakes. Besides the Charleston earthquake of 1868, which 41 lives were lost and about \$5,000,000 worth of property was destroyed, there have been two other notable earthquakes in the United States within historic times—one near the head of the Mississippi delta in 1811-12, and one in the Inyo Valley, Cal., in 1872.

The former, known as the New Madrid earthquake, was remarkable for the length of time which it lasted, and covered. There were several shocks of short intervals for several months, and the whole series of shocks lasted about two years.

The country was sparsely settled, and no scientific records of the shocks were made, but it is stated that the alluvial land of the river bottoms was traversed by visible cracks, and the rocks of the trees to and uprooted many. Huge fissures were opened, and lakes were drained by the escape of their waters into them. The largest sunken area is said to have been 40 or 80 miles long and nearly half as broad.

The Inyo Valley earthquake was caused by a renewed movement along the great fault plain at the eastern base of the Sierra Nevada. The chief shock lasted only a few minutes, but others of less violence continued for two or three months. A tremendous fissure was formed along the base of the mountain range for about 40 miles. The land west of Owens River was temporarily swallowed up. In the village of Inyo all the houses were thrown down, and one-tenth of the inhabitants were killed.
