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STILL UNDER CANVAS.

Baggage Arrives for Some Companies That Will Sleep Better.

Niagara-on-the-Lake, June 10.—(From Our Own Man.)—The weather to-day was superb. It was warm, however, in the afternoon, and the cavalry proceeded to send their heavy sergeants while at drill over in the trenches, where, with pickaxe, spade and shovel, they were engaged in the men labored and perspired. It was no soft job, and many heaved a sigh of relief, as they recalled the easy times they left behind on the farm, where they enlisted in His Majesty's militia, and in the same way.

The delayed baggage of the 12th, 31st, 35th and 36th Regiments arrived during the day, the conventional there are on the ground a total of 244 men and 645 horses, considerably over the strength of the brigade.
