### DEATH OF FRED O'NEIL

Well-Known Resident of Strathroy Succumbs After Long Illness.

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The late Mr. O'Neil was born in North Dorchester. Early in life he went to Petrolia, where he lived many years.

In 1873 he left Petrolia and settled on a farm near Meaford, where he conducted a farm. During this time he was township councillor for some years.

He afterwards removed to Kerwood where he conducted a butcher business, and built the O'Neil House, a large and commodious hotel. He managed the latter until two years ago, when he retired.

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Besides his wife, he is survived by eight sisters: Mrs. Malcolm McNeill and Mrs. Peter Hunter, Metcalfe; Mrs. Frank Hunter, Mrs. George Ansell and Mrs. Ethbert Capstick, North Dorchester; Mrs. W. Empey, Thamesford; Miss Eliza O'Neil and Miss Victoria O'Neil, North Dorchester. His brothers are: H. O'Neil, North Dorchester; John O'Neil, Strathroy. One sister, Jane O'Neil, died some years ago.

Squire Chittick, of this city, is a brother-in-law.

The funeral will take place on Friday at Strathroy.
