WIRELESS 'PHONES WILL BE CARRIED BY ALL PERSONS

Will Soon Be Able To Talk Across the Atlantic, Says Marconi.

PREDICTS DEVELOPMENT

Noted Inventor Foretells Great Discoveries in Next Few Years.

LONDON, Jan. 22.—British Wireless.—"By the time the peace treaty is signed we shall be talking across the Atlantic by wireless," says Geoffrey Isaacs, managing director of the Marconi Wireless Telegraph Company, in an interview. "One day in the not far distant future," he adds, "I think we shall walk about with wireless telephones attached to our bodies, and we shall be able, standing say in Piccadilly Circus, to call up a friend who is flying somewhere. Or we may have an invitation by wireless telephony from a friend flying in France to join him at dinner in the evening."

"Wireless telephony has been very largely used in war for communication between airplanes and headquarters and for artillery work. But there is no reason why it should not be available over very much longer distances."

"It will not be very long before one will be able to sit at one's desk in London and speak to New York practically instantaneously. Equal facilities will be available for communicating with Paris, Rome, Moscow or Amsterdam. In my view it will be as easy to speak to Sydney or Melbourne or to New Zealand."

"Long-distance wireless telephony will apply also to ships at sea and to airplanes and airships."

SEVERAL THOUSAND RIFLES ARE FOUND HIDDEN IN WARSAW

Were To Have Been Issued Against the Late Polish Government.

WARSAW, Tuesday, Jan. 22.—By the Associated Press.—Several thousands of rifles, many machine guns, and thousands of hand grenades, intended for use in an attempt to overturn the Cieslki Government, which has now been succeeded by the Federewski Government, were discovered in Warsaw today. The Government authorities also arrested 1,000 Bolsheviks. The arrests were made in an effort to secure orderly elections to the national assembly.

Prince Sapieha, who led the brief and futile attempt against the Cieslki Government a fortnight ago, is still in prison. He will be released when the political situation becomes settled. However, there is no law under which he can be prosecuted.

LITHUANIA CALLING FOR IMMEDIATE HELP TO STOP BOLSHEVIKI

Fears Libau Will Fall Because German Troops Are Not Dependable.

COPENHAGEN, Jan. 22.—Premier Ulmann of Lithuania, accompanied by a majority of the members of the Lithuanian Cabinet, arrived here last evening from Libau. They left Libau because of the Bolshevik invasion of Lithuania. Premier Ulmann said that the Bolsheviks were not yet masters of Libau and that the provisional Lithuanian Government still had its headquarters there. The Bolshevik forces, however, were only a few days distant and perhaps would arrive within a fortnight. Whether the town could be held against them depended upon the help which the Lithuanian could get abroad, the premier said, and whether the German soldiers in Libau would fight the Bolsheviks.

"We need arms, ammunition and troops," Premier Ulmann added. "That is why we are here. We also wish to communicate with the United States regarding food."

UNION GOVT.'S DELAY HOLDS BACK OPENING OF THE LEGISLATURE

TORONTO, Jan. 22.—Announcement was made today by Sir William Bennett that the Legislature is to be called for Tuesday, February 25. This decision was arrived at today at a meeting of the cabinet. The necessary notices will be sent to the members at once.

Up until a day or two ago it had been generally expected the House would get down to business a week earlier, February 18. At the present session legislation will have to be introduced by the Government to provide for the land settlement scheme for soldiers, which is being worked out jointly with the Federal Government. The delay in opening the House is due to the Government's desire that the Ottawa measures be definitely in shape before calling the Legislature. Otherwise the business to come before the House is in good shape, the premier said.

Manitoba Demands Release of Troops Required on Farms

WINNIPEG, Jan. 22.—Immediate release of soldiers and sailors in Canada who are required on Manitoba farms is demanded by the farmers of the province. A strongly-worded resolution to this effect was unanimously passed at the Union of Manitoba Municipalities convention here today. It will be sent to Ottawa immediately.

Hon. Arthur Meighen, minister of the interior, declared that in his opinion the request of the municipalities convention should be granted and he will take up the matter immediately on his arrival in Ottawa.

GREAT WAR VETERAN FOUND HANGING DEAD

BRANDON, Man., Jan. 22.—Bert Ryder, Brandon, secretary for "Great War Veterans' Association," and an employee of the customs department here, was found dead, hanging from a beam in his own cellar this morning. The police are investigating. Ryder served 29 months in France with the 1st Mounted Rifles. He leaves a widow and baby.

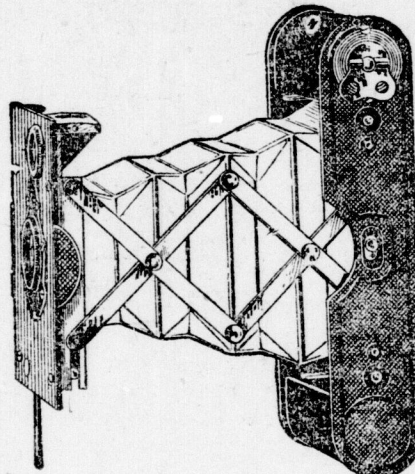
