Men Who Enlisted in 1914 Are in Party - Some Were Prisoners.

A party of 56 Western Ontario sol-A party of 56 Western Ontario soldiers, who left England thirteen days ago on the steamer Royal George, reached London at 9.03 o'clock last night in two coaches attached to the regular west-bound Grand Trunk train. They were taken to Tecumseh Barracks in A. S. C. motor busses and private automobiles, arriving at the dispersal station at about 9.20 o'clock.

Savings Building. LONDON, CANADA. By 10 o'clock all of them had been discharged, and by 10.15 the last of the strangglers who had stayed to cash checks, etc., were on their way downtown again.

All but eight of the men live outside of London, but, although some of them could have caught trains for their homes, practically all of them decided to spend the night in the city. Some went to the Y. M. C. A., others to the homes of chums with homes in London, but the majority chose to sleep in downtown hotels, declaring that they wanted to experience the feeling that they, like other civilians, could command service for which they were willing to pay.

The military and civilian cars which took the men to Tecumseh Barracks waited and conveyed them downtown again.

Crowd at Depot. and a large crowd of citizens bade the returning men welcome with hearty cheers. The coaches containing the soldiers were "spotted" opposite the passage-way between the baggage-room and the express sheds, and the veterans passed directly through this passageway to the waiting automobiles. Many of them were accompanied to Carling Heights by relatives and friends, who had met them at the station.

Several original 18th Battalion men were in the party, which included also a number of men who went overseas with the 63rd Battery, one man who had been a prisoner of war for two years and eight months, and another who had been at the front with an A. M. C. unit since August, 1914, and wore the Mons star ribbon on his tunic. the Mons star ribbon on his tunic.

The 18th "Originals" included the following: Corp. S. Slatterley, of St. Thomas, who spent more than three years in the fighting line, and was sent to England on December 17 of last year

with a lowered medical category; Sergt. Bert Dennison of Walton, who was wounded at Ypres in June, 1916, and who served with the 18th before and who served with the 18th before and after that time for a total period of more than three years; Sergt. William Grace of Galt, who was wounded at St. Eloi, and again at Vimy. He won the M. M. at Cambrai on October 11. 1918, for carrying on with his platoon against heavy fire after all the officers had been killed; Pte. G. F. Lewis of Aylmer, who was transferred to the 4th Machine Gun Brigade soon after

4th Machine Gun Brigade soon after landing in France, and who served at the front continuously until wounded at Arras on September 13, 1918.

An Original First.

Pte. T. W. Byatt of Parkhill went overseas with the first contingent as a member of the 3rd Battalion, in which he enlisted in Toronto in August, 1914. He went to France in February, 1915, and served at the front until the early spring of the following year, when he was captured by the Germans and sent to a prison camp not far from the Dutch border.

Pte. Byatt declared that none of the stories of German cruelty to prisoners had been exaggerated. He and other prisoners, for some time after his arrival at the prison camp, were put to work at stokers in a gas plant. They were made to work twelve hours a day, except every other Sunday, when




