Dominion of Canada



Department of Finance

ALL persons residing in Canada, employed in Canada, or carrying on business in Canada, are liable to a tax on income, as follows:

1. Every unmarried person, or widow, or widower, without dependants as defined by the Act, who during the calendar year 1919 received or earned \$1,000 or more.

2. All other individuals who during the calendar year 1919 received or earned \$2,000 or

3. Every corporation and joint stock company whose profits exceeded \$2,000 during the fiscal year ended in 1919.

Forms to be used in filing returns on or before the 30th of April, 1920.

ALL INDIVIDUALS other than farmers and ranchers must use Form T 1.

FARMERS AND RANCHERS must use Form T 1A.

CORPORATIONS and joint stock companies must use Form

Penalty

Every person required to make a return, who falls to do so within the time limit, shall be mbject to a penalty of Twenty-five per centum of the amount of the taz payable.

Any person, whether taxable, or otherwise o faile to make a return or provide informa tion duly required according to the provision of the Act, shall be liable on summary conviction alty of \$100 for each day during ng a false statement in any return or in action required by the Minister, shall ot exceeding \$19,000, or to six months impreson er to both fine and imprisonm

General Instructions.

Obtain Forms from the Inspectors or Assistant Inspectors of Taxation or from Postmasters.

Read carefully all instructions or Form before filling it in.

Prepay postage on letters and documents forwarded by mail to Inspectors of Taxation.

Make your returns promptly and avoid penalties.
