**DR. F. E. CLARK IMPROVING**

Boston, Aug. 4—The condition of Rev. Francis E. Clark, founder of the Christian Endeavor movement, who has been ill at Sagamore Beach for more than two months, continues to show improvement, according to reports received at his office.

Several weeks ago there was considerable anxiety regarding his condition, but it is now believed that the crisis has passed, although he is still very weak. During the last few days he has sat up in bed for half an hour each day, and the family is feeling much encouraged.

**FOR THE CUBAN SERVICE**

Two very suitable Norwegian steamers have been chartered by Blackford & Black Limited, of Halifax, for the service from Halifax to Cuba and Jamaica. They are the Atlantis and the Jose, 1,250 and 1,212 tons gross respectively. The Atlantis will arrive in Halifax about the middle of September, and the Jose is expected at Halifax about the end of that month. The steamer Anita was wrecked on the Cuban coast last year when on the service of the line, and since that time the Atlantis, also Norwegian, has been the sole boat on the service.
