

7 DIE, 4 HURT IN TRAIN CRASH

Cars Pile up in Heart of Illinois Town; Tramps Victims

WINANET, Ill., Aug. 22—Grinding down Buda Hill at a mile a minute, an east bound freight train of the Chicago, Burlington & Quincy piled up in the heart of the town this morning, killing seven persons and injuring four others.

A broken arch bar connecting the trucks of a car is believed to have caused the wreck. Eighteen cars carrying perishable freight were thrown from the tracks in front of the spot and overturned.

The men killed and injured were young tramps riding in one car. The four taken to hospital were said to be near death. None of the killed had been identified tonight and some were believed to be mangled beyond recognition.


MUCH TRACK RIPPED UP.
More than 12,200 feet of double track right of way was ripped up and hundreds of laborers were rushed to the scene to repair the damage.

The middle section of the train, which consisted largely of refrigerator cars, lapped from the rails as it passed the depot in the centre of the town and pitched over on the right of way. Many of the cars remained on the tracks when the air-brakes locked. The crew escaped injury.

NORTHEAST HARBOR, Maine, Aug. 23—Dr. Charles W. Eliot, president emeritus of Harvard University, died at his home yesterday in his 92nd year.

Dr. Eliot had been in delicate health since he came here early in the summer and has been confined to the house of late. He had spent his summers at Northeast Harbor since the early 80's. The end came peacefully late yesterday.

Funeral services will be held in the Union church here on Tuesday at noon, and services will be held also in Appleton Chapel at Harvard University, Cambridge, Mass., on Wednesday.

BANDITS HOLD UP STREET CAR; KILL 2

Armed Men Board Mexican Tram and Rob Terrorized Passengers

MEXICO CITY, Aug. 23—Two passengers were killed and three seriously and several slightly wounded, when bandits held up an electric street car running between Puebla and Cholula yesterday.

Five armed men boarded the car and forced the motorman to stop. Thereupon about 20 bandits began firing into the car and afterwards entered it and robbed the terrorized passengers. Some of the wounded are expected to die, among them the motorman, and Antonio Alegria, chief of police of Cholula. Federal troops are pursuing the bandits.

DUBLIN, Aug. 23—An interesting feature of the preliminary report of the Irish census, showing a decrease in the population of all Ireland of 161,000 during the past 15 years, is that males outnumber females in the Free State for the first time since 1841.

Reversing the relative positions of the census of 1911, there are now 973 women in the Free State for every 1,000 men. In Northern Ireland there are 1,086 women for every 1,000 men.

Spanish Reserve Is Third In Europe

Madrid, (United Press)—Spain, although enjoying a modest trade compared with the great Powers, nevertheless holds in the vaults of the Bank of Spain a hoard of gold surpassed, in Europe, only by the gold reserves of London and Paris.

Outside of Europe, Spain is distanced only by New York and Tokyo. The nation's gold reserve is today estimated at around \$505,000,000.

Before the war her gold reserve was \$305,000,000. She began drawing gold from the United States during the war until now she has become what the London money-market calls a "gold trap."



GOLD STRIKE ON SOUTH SEA ISLAND

Mountainous Difficulties to be Overcome by Hardy Adventurers

SYDNEY, Aug. 23—Adventurers have found a new El Dorado in the South Seas.

According to authentic reports from Morobe (New Guinea), a rich gold strike has been made in wild mountainous country beyond Salima. Four centuries ago Alvaro de Saavedra and his hardy Spanish voyagers, sailing from the western coast of Mexico, coasted along the northern shores of New Guinea, and gave to the country the name Isla del Oro (Island of Gold). It is claimed now that for the first time the name is to justify itself.

Already shipments of gold from the new field have arrived at Sydney, and outgoing vessels are carrying increased passenger lists. But men experienced in the country say that the story of the

Salima field will be the same as many others where nature has hidden her gold from men—a story of whitening bones and ill-rewarded effort.

The field is situated in a district which has more than 200 inches of rainfall a year. Malaria, dysentery, and worst of all, the dreaded black-water fever, play havoc with travelers who venture into its area. The natives are the fiercest in the whole of New Guinea, and have not yet come under the spell of the white man's civilization.

Tools, stores, and even food, every ounce of it, have to be carried over a series of high mountains from the seaboard. The field lies but 15 miles from the nearest port, as the bird flies, but those 15 miles are converted into many more by the rough untamed nature of the country. It takes a fully laden native carrier—the only method of transport—seven or eight days to travel those few miles.

Such is the citadel in which the yellow god has fortified himself in the new El Dorado. Despite official warnings of the difficulties ahead, many Australian adventurers have already set out to woo fortune in this new world.
