IRISH POPULATION DECREASES 161,000

Census Shows That Males Outnumber Females in Free

DUBLIN, Aug. 23—An interesting feature of the preliminary report of the Irish census, showing a decrease in the population of all Ireland of 161,000 during the past 15 years, is that males outnumber females in the Free State. Reversing the relative positions of the census of 1911, there are now 973 women in the Free State for every 1,000 men. In Northern Ireland there are 1,066 women for every 1,000 men.
