## AMATEUR SPORT WILL BE PLACED ON OLD FOOTING

### A. W. Covey Speaks on Reinstatement and Registration of Athletes

(Amherst News.)

Amateur sport is due for a big boost, within the coming months, and the conditions that have been existent in sport for the past five years, will have to be abolished. So said A. W. Covey, vice-president of the Maritime Branch of the Amateur Athletic Union of Canada, to the News in an interview today.

Nova Scotia, New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island, are now holding a house cleaning along the lines of amateur sport—inclusive of baseball, hockey, football, basketball and all track events. Practically every line of sport is included in the list, with the exception of bowling.

The Maritime branch of the A. A. U. of C. has been reformed. Different clubs have been notified of this fact, and already the five organizations in St. John that conduct the sporting events of that city, have fallen in line with the idea.

Athletic clubs in Moncton, Sussex and Fredericton have already come into the fold of the reconstructed association. In Halifax, the Wanderers have been steady upholders of amateur sport, the numerous other clubs in the Nova Scotian capital are likewise in line. The colleges, namely Dalhousie, Acadia, Kings, Mount Allison, St. Francis Xavier, University of New Brunswick and St. Dunstons have applauded the renovation, and joined up.

Maritime sport will be given a thorough cleaning—not a whitewash. In the future every athlete, in competing against bona-fide amateurs, must have his registration card, and in making this application, the entrant, if not a member of any club, must be sanctioned by three people.

Reinstatement is being accorded all athletes who have not competed for money. Competition against professionals did not count against reinstatement. In fact to be candid, there is hardly an athlete in the provinces particularly in the more active games, that has not some time or other, played with or against professionals.

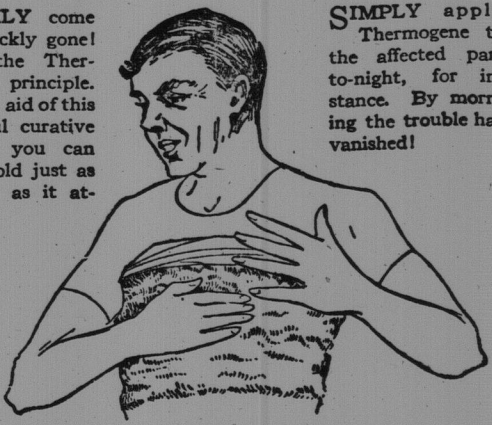
Applications for reinstatement and registration cards can be made to L. Gastonguay at Halifax. A small fee is charged for the cards, but next summer, when the sport season becomes more active, registration will certainly prove invaluable to the man who has intentions of participating in any branch of athletics.

The sensational little British flyweight had come to America for the purpose of demonstrating his ability before American followers of the ring sport, against American boxers in American rings. While here Wilde will mix pleasure with business, for he plans a tour of the country, particularly the western section, which will commence in about a week and continue until January. His American representative, George Dwyer, stated yesterday, however, that Wilde will arrange for matches under reasonable conditions as frequently as the promoters here submit attractive inducements.
