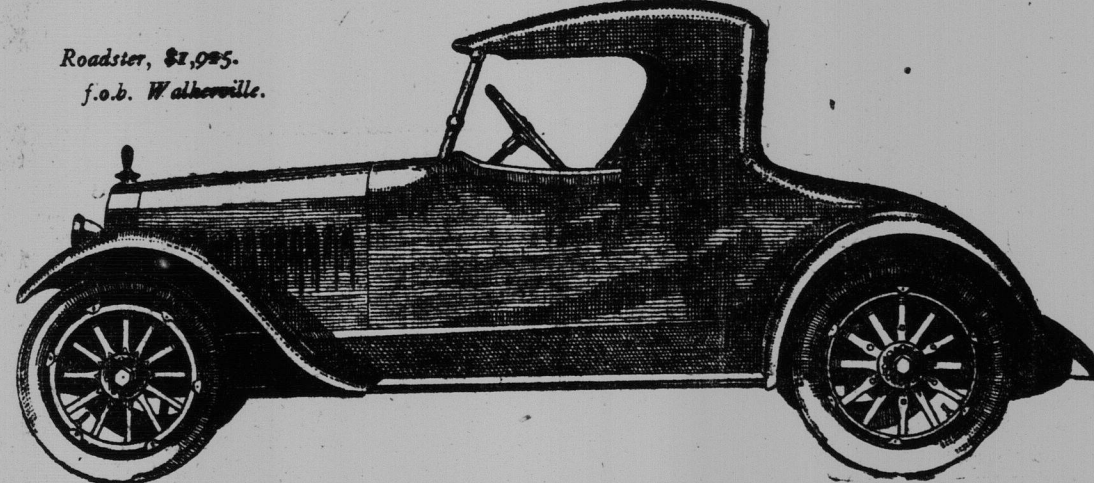
Messrs. Fisher, Hipwell and Ketchum were killed in their country's service at the front, and word was received last
