Daily Hints For the Cook

GOOD CHICKEN SALAD. Cut cold roast pork in cubes, mix with chopped celery, garnish the dish with celery leaves; pour a boiled dressing over it.

CHOCOLATE CARAMELS. One pound sugar, quarter pound chocolate, half cup milk or cream, half cup butter, half cup molasses, one teaspoon vanilla, and, if liked, one cup chopped walnuts. Cook all together except vanilla and nuts till it forms a good chewy ball, when dropped in cold water. Take from the fire, add vanilla and nuts and pour at once into shallow pan, roll inches, which has been well buttered. This is a confectioner's rule, and fine.
