Woman Held in \$36,000 Bail on Charges of Child Substitution

Two Tiny Bodies Exhumed by Investigators in New York.

NEW YORK, May 15.—District Attorney Pecora announced today that a Grand Jury investigation of the "baby farm" conducted in this city by Mrs. Helen Auguste Geison-Volk would be started next Tuesday. Mrs. Geison-Volk is held in \$36,000 bail on charges of child substitution and violation of the sanitary code in housing more babies than her license allowed.

IRELAND TRANQUIL SAYS GEN. O'DUFFY

Absolute Peace Reigns and Free State Constabulary Members Carry no Guns.

NEW YORK, May 15.—"There is absolute peace in Ireland today. I know that disapproves a number of people who would like disruption and constant warfare in the Free State, but it can't be helped," said General O'Duffy, chief of the Free State's Constabulary, at a press conference here today. C. P. FLIER WILL CUT TIME TO B. C. COAST

Service Starts From Montreal on Sunday—Four Days For Journey.

MONTREAL, May 15.—Made up of all steel five proof cars carrying 80 beds from Montreal and 72 from Toronto, the Trans-Canada Limited, the Canadian Pacific Railway flyer, will start on its first across-the-continent trip of the season to Vancouver on Sunday, May 17 from Montreal at 7:45 daylight saving time.

The current season is the seventh from the inception of the flyer, and the service have been improved each year. The running time this year between Montreal and Vancouver will be 89 hours, 15 minutes westbound, and 88 hours, 30 minutes eastbound. Passengers will arrive at Winnipeg on the morning of the second day, at Calgary on the morning of the third day, and Vancouver on the morning of the fourth day. This schedule has been drawn up with a special view to the convenience of business men.

The Trans-Canada Limited is the last word in transportation facilities between this city and Vancouver. A journey by this train furnishes a lesson in practical Canadian geography. It traverses the populated commercial sections of Ontario, passes through the immense prairie country, penetrates the Canadian Rockies, runs finally through the rich plain of British Columbia into Vancouver.

Included in its equipment is a compartment car with observations and lounge room which is used on the entire trip. Through the mountain section between Calgary and Banff, and an open top observation car is at the disposal of passengers.

REFUSES TO SIGN DEATH WARRANTS

Sofia Plotters in Custody—Others Killed When Court-martial Convened.

VIENNA, May 16.—An unconfirmed dispatch from Sofia says that King Boris has refused to sign the death warrants of the men condemned to hang for plotting the Sveti Krali Cathedral bomb explosion.

Only three of the condemned men are in custody. Several were killed by the time when court-martial convened and the others have escaped the military search which has been in progress since the blast shook Sofia.
