I attempted to pass him but he jumped into the path of my vehicle and called out insulting remarks to with the Major and systic. We were the only occupants of the vehicle. I stopped the vehicle and Major LaCornu got out and told the soldier that he was a Major of the U.S. Army. This soldier whom I now identify as Pte Goodie, F. the accused, said "I don't give a fuck if you are, and that "American soldiers are all bastards" of the Major and the accused the former returned to the wehicle and I started the motor to drive away. At that point there was a sound of a blow and I looked up in time to see the Majors cap lying on the rear seat. We then drove to the American Military Police Office. In my opinion the accused was quite sober and in full possession of his senses."
