PLANS COMPLETE FOR SUMMER PLAYGROUND

Centennial Grounds Only Will Be Opened

Teachers Appointed—Will Continue Only if Sufficient Funds are Received.

Despite the fact that the Common Council has decided against granting a sum to carry on the supervised playgrounds during the coming year, the Centennial grounds will be opened as usual.

The Centennial grounds will be fully equipped for the enjoyment of the young ones. The swings, sand pits, blocks and rings will again be found ready for use.

When the customary sum of \$200 to defray the expenses was refused by the common council the school board was appealed to by the parents and asked to assume control of the playgrounds.

It should be recognized that of the thousands of children who receive the two months vacation during the summer months, there are many hundreds who cannot possibly go to the country.

It is not expected that a full committee meeting will be held until after the opening of the Centennial grounds.
