Bar Harbor, Me., Sept. 3.—All arrangements are complete for a rousing welcome to Vice-Admiral G. D. Bedford, K. C. B., and the five British warships, comprising his squadron, which are expected to arrive tomorrow forenoon, unless the present southwest gale delays them.

All the warships of the American squadron are anchored in the harbor. The flagship New York and the gunboat Scorpion which arrived on Sunday were joined this morning by the Massachusetts, the Indiana, the Texas, Kentucky and the Pensacola.
