Mr. Ellis, resigning to become a candidate for the Commons. Supported the Blair Administration until May, 1889, when he resigned his seat with Mr. Stockton, and went into opposition on the appointment of Solr. Gen. Ritchie as Police Magistrate of St. John, contrary to his recommendation. Was re-elected at the g. e., 1890, 1892 and 1895. A Liberal.—St. John, N.B.

B. in the City of Quebec, 23 Aug., 1846, and ed. at the Seminary there. M., 1880, Miss Kate Hartt. Was Collector of Customs at Edmundston 1866-7; in business at Fort Kent, Maine, until 1885, when he returned to Edmundston, where he is now a general merchant. First returned to Ho. of Assem. at g. e., 1895. A Conservative. —Edmundston.

BEVERIDGE, ADAM J. (Victoria).

B. in Kinross-shire, Scot., in 1826, and came to Can. with his brother, Hon. B. Beveridge, when 15 years of age. M. Hannah Britt, of Kingsclear. Has been engaged in the lumbering business, and has been a Municipal Councillor. First returned to Ho. of Assem. at g. e., 1895. A Liberal.—Andoper.

BLACK, JOHN (York).

S. of Rev. John Black, Episcopal clergyman, and of Sarah, sister of the late Judge Wetmore. B. at Kingsclear, 1856. Ed. at Fredericton. M. Miss Robb, from Boston. Called to the Bar, N.B., 1876. Was a mem. of the City Council of Fredericton for 2 years, and has been County Auditor and Secty. Treas. of the Co. of York. First returned to Ho. of Assem. at g. e., 1895. A Liberal.—Fredericton.

BURCHILL, Hon. JOHN PERCIVAL (Northumberland).

B. at Miramichi, N.B., in 1855, and was ed. at the Grammar School there. M., 1882, dan. of Judge Wilkin-
