Christian Majesty, of Their desire to obliterate every trace of that disastrous cpocha so happily terminated by the present peace. engages on His part, when complete justice shall be rendered to His subjects, to renounce the whole amount of the balance which shall appear in His favour for support of the prisoners of war, so that the ratification of the report of the above commissioners, and the discharge of the sums due to British Subjects, as well as the restitution of the effects which shall be proved to belong to them, shall complete the renunciation.

ARTICLE V.

The two High Contracting Parties, desiring to establish the most friendly relations between Their respective subjects, reserve to Themselves, and promise to come to a mutual understanding and .rrangement, as soon as possible, upon Their commercial erests, with the view of encouraging and increasing the promitive of Their respective States.

The present Additional Articles shall have the same force and validity as if they were inserted word for word in the Treaty Patent of this day. They shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at the same time.

In witness whereof, the respective plenipotentiaries have signed and affixed to them the seals of their arms.

Done at Paris, the thirtieth day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fourteen.
