Uplands, Ontario	November 1st 1943		Cloudy to partly cloudy. Flying for most of the day.	
	November 2nd 1943		Rain, low clouds. Flying washed out. Funeral of P/O Walter Tuhkanen, missing since November 26th, 1942, and located near Low, Quebec, on October 29th, by employees of the Gatineau Boom Company, was held today from Hulse and Playfair Funeral Home to Beechwood Cemetery, Ottawa. Flight Lieutenant Bishop was in charge of the funeral party, with the R.C.A.F. Central Band attending. The Protestant Chaplain, Flight Lieutenant Perkins, officiated at the funeral service at the graveside. The funeral of LAC Stuart Morrison, pupil killed at the same time, was held this afternoon at Lachine, Quebec, with arrangements in the hands of No. 5 "M" Depot. Flight Lieutenant W.B.H. Fry accompanied the body to Lachine. "Thank Your Lucky Stars" was again shown in the Recreation Hall to a large audience of movie fans.	
	November 3rd 1943		Overcast. R163157, LAC Craig, J., ground-looped Harvard 3282 at main aerodrome. A "B" category accident with no injury to pilot.	
	November 4th 1943		Low clouds, fog. The Commanding Officer entertained the Senior Flying Instructors and Training Wings Staff at a dinner at the Chateau Laurier.	
	November 5th 1943		Considerable fog patches in morning. Cloudy to overcast in afternoon.	
	November 6th 1943		Overcast to cloudy, rain showers. Usual Saturday evening movie - "A Night to Remember" with Loretta Young and Brian Aherne. "The Community Sing", an added short, struck the popular fancy. Approximately seventy students from Ottawa High Schools were shown around the Station by Officers from Training Wing in connection with a Recruiting Drive now under way.
