My dear Martin:

I write to remind you of our talk together, and your promise to see that steps are immediately taken to have a convention called in Assiniboia and a Liberal candidate placed in the field.

I met Mr. Motherwell at the Chateau Laurier on Saturday evening, and told him of the conclusion we had reached as to the course it seemed wisest to pursue. Mr. Motherwell was in hearty agreement. He was to leave for the West yesterday, and said he would stop at Regina to talk over the subject of the convention with members of your Government and yourself. It will help us everywhere if an immediate satisfactory choice can be made.

I should like again to express the great pleasure it is to me to be once more actively associated with yourself in promoting the principles of Liberalism in our country.
