as to the admission of new provinces; -

Sec 146 - admission of new colonies or addresses from the present of Queen, and from the respective legisl.^{re}s of Newfoundland, P.R., Ed., &c, and B.C. - Rupert's Land and N.W. Territory might be admitted on the address of the Queen, present.

\$300,000 were paid ^{Hudson Bay Co.} on condition of the surrender of Rupert's Land to the dominion - certain lands and privileges being reserved to the Co., an Act 1869 was passed for the temporary govt of Rupert's Land & N.W.T., when united with Canada this did not work well and in 1870 Macleau first passed an act to establish a province for govt of Manitoba - a new prov. formed out of N.W.T. In the same year the N.W.T. & Rupert's Land became part of the dominion of Queen.

In 1871 B.C. Columbia was admitted on above condition (address from H.O.G.B.)

In 1873, P.E.I. on address from both govt was admitted on conditions including representation in Senate of P.E.I. and the continuance of the local govt on the same basis as in other provs.

An Imp. Order in Council was passed in 1860. giving to dominion all P.R. territory & possessions in N.A. (Newfoundland excepted)
