

As to the admission of new provinces; -

Sec 146 - admission of other colonies on address from the President of Canada, and from the respective legislatures of New Brunswick, P.E.I., and British Columbia. Rupert's Land and N.W. Territory might be admitted on the address of the Gov. of Canada.

\$300,000 were paid on condition of the surrender of Rupert's Land to the Dominion - certain lands and privileges being reserved to the Co. An Act 1869 was passed for the temporary govt of Rupert's Land & N.W.T., when united with Canada this did not work well and in 1870 Macleod passed an act to establish & provide for govt of Manitoba - a new prov. formed out of N.W.T. In the same year the N.W.T. & Rupert's Land became part of the Dominion of Canada.

In 1871 Br. Columbia was admitted on alone condition (address from H of C)

In 1873, P.E.I. on address from both govt was admitted on conditions including representation in Senate of C. and the continuance of the local govt on the same basis as in other provs.

Newfoundland has not as yet sanctioned the necessary address.

An Imp. order in Council was passed in 1880. giving to Dominion all Br. territory & possessions in N.A. (Newfoundland excepted)
