Sir,

Referring to Voucher No 2791 amounting to \$25.10, which accompanied your letter of the 16th instant, I beg to say that you should not have purchased two strings of bells at a cost of \$5.50 nor the rubber sheet at \$3.50, without authority. You were authorized to buy three pairs of blankets at a total cost of \$12.00. If you did not need three pairs of blankets you should not have used the money for other purposes without first obtaining the sanction of the Department.

Money that is voted and authorized for special purposes must not be used in future for other purposes, without authority being asked and obtained from the Department.
