Madam,

On April 14th, last, you were written to and advised of an increase in your salary and asked for a report upon your work at the Sagamook Indian school. No acknowledgment of this letter has been received, but the Department is in receipt of a communication from Mr. Agent Hagan enclosing a list of articles for which you have asked to provide the mid-day meal and give lessons in cooking to the children. Mr. Hagan has been authorized to purchase these articles, but in the meantime the Department would like to have ^{the} report asked for in the letter above referred to and at the same time to say that it is only the intation to supply a simple mid-day meal to supplement the lunches brought by the children from their homes, and before any further purchases can be authorized it will be necessary for you to make a statement in detail of the number of meals served and the cooking lessons given with the provisions already granted.

It is trusted that this simple meal will prove an incentive to more regular attendance and also be a benefit to the girls who receive instruction in preparing it.
