Ottawa, June 25, 1911.

Sir,

I have to request you to be good enough to proceed at your early convenience to make a survey for this Department at Aups Indian reserve in Bute Inlet, of a small piece of land adjoining the said reserve.

A school house and an Indian graveyard are situated outside the limits of the reserve and are included in a piece of land which has been pre-empted by Mr. W. Thompson. The Deputy Minister of Lands has decided to eliminate from the said pre-emption the land occupied by the school and graveyard, you have therefore to survey the said portion of land. I am unable to even give you its approximate limits; it however should have its boundaries run N. and S., E. and W., and be contiguous to the reserve as shown roughly on the sketch herewith.

Please plant substantial wooden posts at each end of the four corners, squared and with the letters I. R., cut in them. Each post is to be well rounded with earth and preferably with stones if these can be obtained.

The returns should consist of a plan, field-notes, report and account, all in duplicate. You will be allowed at the rate of \$10.00 per day together with reasonable travelling and living expenses. I may add that you are expected to carry out this work with every reasonable economy.
