Sir:-

I beg to inform you that you are hereby appointed medical officer in the room of Dr. Brydon-Jack to render all medical and surgical attendance required by the Indians of the under-mentioned Bands, and furnish all medicines required in your practice, in return for an annual salary of \$1,200

You should visit at reasonable intervals in order to have a general over-sight of the Indian Reserves at False Creek, Mission, Musqueam, Cayilano and Seymour Creek, and you should respond to all calls made upon you by the Indians of the said Bands; and also attend in all cases which may be brought to your special attention by the Indian Agent Mr. Peter Byrne, of New Westminster.

In addition to visiting the above mentioned Bands you should also render medical aid to any Indians visiting the above mentioned Reserves, who may call at your office in Vancouver, and also to any Indians belonging to the following Bands who may apply to you there for your services, namely:- Sechelt, Sliammon, Homalke, Klahoose, Howe Sound, Squamish River and Bute Inlet or Malespina Str.

It should be understood that the salary covers all operations, which you may be called upon from time to time to perform, in addition to ordinary
