Sir.-

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 15th instant, in regard to issue of patent for lot 13 block 36, The Pas, and inclosing a transfer to His Majesty The King, in right of the Dominion of Canada.

In reply I would say that, as this lot has been taken possession of by the Hudson Bay Company, the Department is prepared to waive the conditions of sale with regard to erection of buildings, and as the purchase price has been paid Letters Patent will be issued to the purchaser, Mr. Ulric St. Godard, upon your advising as to his name in full, place of residence and occupation.

The transfer sent in will be returned to you, so that you can have the certificate of title issued in the name of His Majesty The King, when letters patent are transmitted to the Registrar of Titles, Neepawa.
