
Sir,-

The Department is informed that you are neglecting to send your two children, Mary and Loran, regularly to school.

I have, therefore, to inform you that if you do not see that your children attend school regularly, the Department will be compelled to take action under the Regulations Relating to the Education of Indian Children and have them committed to a residential school. You yourself are liable to fine or imprisonment if you neglect, after receiving this notice, to see that they attend school each day it is open and that they remain there during the regular school hours.

It is hoped that you will heed this notice and that there will be no need to take action as mentioned above and that you will see that your children attend school regularly each day in future.
