I bought a side of this stock and took it to Bear River Reserve and had an Indian make up five pairs of Maccassins. I paid \$5.00 for the stock and gave the Indian \$1.00 per. pair to make them. I placed them in a local shee store to be seld to the Tourists. I new have an order new for 24 pairs of these shees, at \$2.00 per. pair. I know that in a large quantity they can be produced for \$1.50 per. pair. If I had the time I could do a great many things for these People to help maintain t themselves. I find they have a lot of talent and can produce many things of value if they had semeene to lead them . I have get all of them to work new making souvenir goods for eld Heme Week, and not enly my Indians, but the Indians from two other Agencies. I hve permission from their Agents to do this. Right here I wish to thank you for the Benation of \$50.00 to be used to build an encampment. I intend to parade the Indians and have made arrangements for four Floats. My scheme is to bring them before the strangers, then when they offer their Wares, they have a good chance to make sales. If I was a man of Means I would close my business out and help the Indians along. The Majority are ready and willing to follow out my suggestions. Yours truly, Indian Affairs.
