- A Well, he told me, Sir, that there would be a parade, and I asked him what would be the dress and hesaid there would be no gaiters; it was a Sports parade, he said. He told me to tell Private Advent to be on the parade.
- Q Did he tell you to tell Private Advent?
- A He just asked if I would, Sir, so I did.
- What did you say to Private Advent?
- A I told him there was going to be a Sports parade, and Sergeant Flynn asked me to tell him to appear on this parade.
-) What kind of a parade?
- A I seid Sports parade, Sir; that is what he told me. Cross-examined by the Prosecutor:
- A How do you mean?
- The time of the day?
- A He said ten after One, Sir.
- On the 17th?
- A On the 17th May, 1945.
- There did he say you were to fall in?
- A In front of the Q.M. Stores.
 - The belonging Officer declines to re-examine this Witness.

Questioned by the Court:

- Were you on the parade?
- A Yes. Sir.
- , Jid you see the accused on the parade?
- A I don't know if I did, Sir.
 - By the Court: That is all.
 - The sitness withdraws.
 - The Prosecutor makes a closing address.
 - The Defending Officer makes a closing address. -
