

COPY for Mr. GILLETT

Minutes of Meeting held for the purpose of electing new  
Council at Hartley Bay, B.C.

Thursday, Jan. 8, 1942.

A General Meeting of the electorate of the village of Hartley Bay was held at 11 a.m., for the purpose of electing a new Council. Mr. J. Gillett, Indian Agent, presided.

Before proceeding with the election, the retiring Council indicated its desire that several items of business be discussed with the Indian Agent.

These were-----

1. The following motion was made by Edward Clifton and seconded by Lewis Clifton

"That the property now owned by Mr. Morehouse, adjoining the Hartley Bay Reserve, be purchased by the Department and restored to the Reserve"

Passed Unanimously.

2. The Meeting expressed the wish that strong representation be made to the Department that sufficient lumber be supplied by the Dept., to complete the re-construction of the village sidewalk. The people to perform all labour.

3. It was moved by Edward Clifton and seconded by Lewis Clifton,

"That in view of the fact that plans are in existence for a waterworks system for the village of Hartley Bay, that the Department be urged to carry out this project for the betterment of living conditions in the village".

Passed Unanimously.

4. The question of relief for widows and those unable to work was brought to the attention of Mr. Gillett, who stated that the matter is always given careful consideration when application is made in the proper manner.
