There shall be a public Weigh House and Weighing Machine established at the Central Market, so soon as there are funds appropriated or applicable for the purpose, and there shall be established from time to time such other Weigh Houses and Weighing Machines, at such other place or places in the said City as may be expedient, and as the Council may by By-Law direct.

XIII. The purchaser of any hay, straw, wood, fresh meat, dairy produce, farm or garden produce, or any other article or thing sold by weight or measure may demand that the same shall be weighed or measured by the Weigh Master, or any of his assistants; and the seller of any such hay, straw, wood fresh meat, dairy, farm or garden produce, or any such other article or thing so sold by weight or measure, who refuses such demand or refuses to produce the "weigh note" relating to said purchase for inspection, when demanded by said purchaser, shall be deemed guilty of an infraction of this By-Law

XIV. That all weigh notes given for articles or loads weighed by the said Weigh Master, or his assistants, shall be binding and final, as to their contents, upon all parties concerned in the

buying or selling of the articles or loads.

XV. That all the Markets shall be kept open as provided in the eighth clause of this By-Law and only at such times as is therein provided. Butchers, however, may open their stalls and supply any steam boat or other vessel coming into the City after Market hours, upon application to the Superintendent or his assistants.

XVI. That every person selling meat or articles of provision by retail, whether by weight or measure, in the City, shall provide himself with scales, weights and measures, regularly stamped, marked and adjusted by the Inspector of Weights and Measures, but no spring balance, spring scale, or spring weighing machine shall be used, or allowed to be used, for any Market purpose.

XVII. That every person frequenting the Markets with articles of provision or produce for sale, shall place his waggon, sleigh, or other vehicle, in such order as the Market Superintendent shall direct, and no person shall b. allowed to have any waggon, or other vehicle in the Markets, except in such place as may be directed by said Superintendent; nor shall any butcher or other person, place, tie, or allow to be placed or tied, upon any pathway or road surrounding any market any calf, sheep, swine, or other animal.

XVIII. That no person shall bring into, or leave in any of the public markets of the City, any waggon, cart, sleigh, or other vehicle, nor shall stand thereon to sell therefrom any article, not being farmer's produce or vegetables, or not expressly specified in this By-Law as allowed to be sold therein; nor shall any person sell any article in any of the public Markets in a manner contrary to the provisions of this By-

XIX. That in case any person sells, or exposes for sale, any goods, provisions, or other articles, contrary to any of the provisions of this By-

Law, the person so offending, shall, after being warned by the Market Superintendent, or other person duly authorized, be summarily removed, together with his goods, provisions, or other articles, out of the public Markets, or boundaries aforesaid, and every person or persons hindering, obstructing, or molesting the said Superintendent, or other authorized person aforesaid, in the performance of his duty, shall be subject to the penalties of this By-Law.

XX. That all butchers and other persons, who resort to, and use the public Markets, now or hereafter to be established within this City, for the purpose of carrying on their trade or calling, or selling or disposing of articles, in such Markets in the said City, shall be subject to the

XXI. That no butcher or other person shall cut up, sell, or expose for sale, any fresh meat, in any part of this City, except in the shops or stalls in the public Markets, and that the said Butchers be restricted to the sale of flesh and fowl, and, until a Fish Market is regularly established within the said city, they be allowed to sell fish.

XXII. That any person or persons permitted to occupy, as a butcher, any of the stalls for the sale of fresh or salt meat, in any of the markets established, or which may be hereafter established in this City, shall keep his, her, or their stall in a clean and proper state, and shall not suffer any offal, hides, or any offensive thing, to remain on or near the premises after eight o'clock in the morning of any market day.

XXIII. That no person having a shop, stall, or standing in any of the Markets of the City, shall underlet the said shop, stall, or standing or shall place or leave any one in the same, under pretence of taking charge thereof, without having first obtained leave in writing from the said

Market Committee.

XXIV. That no person shall place, or cause, or permit to be placed, in any of the passages or open spaces in any of the public Markets, any bench, table, chair, or any other article or substance whatsoever, which may be calculated to obstruct the free use of the whole of such passage or open space, without having first obtained leave in writing from the said committee.

XXV. That every farmer from the country may, after the hour of twelve o'clock noon, but not before he has paid the proper market fee at any of the public Markets, sell fresh meat, the produce of his own farm, by the quarter, or any greater quantity, and other articles of farm produce of his own raising, throughout the

XXVI. That no farmer, or any other person, shall sell or dispose of, or offer for sale, or exchange any article of provision, upon any of the public streets of the City, unless he or she has first been to one of the public Markets and

paid the proper fee.

XXVII. That no huckster or dealer, or his, her, or their servant or agent, or any person on his, her, or their behalf, shall directly or indirectly purchase, or cause to be purchased, from any farmer or other person, any meat, poultry, or other article of provision, brought in for sale, or offered for sale in this City, before the hour of ten o'clock in the forenon, for the purpose of selling the same again, nor shall any huck-ster or dealer, or his, her, or their servant or
