BRAYS CROSSING. A country post office in Osgoode township, Carlton County, 20 miles south of Ottawa, the county seat, and nearest banking point, and 3 from Osgoode Station, the nearest shipping point. Settled in 1884. It contains Methodist, Presbyterian and Catholic churches and public and separate schools, and ships grain and produce. Population, 100. Mail tri-weekly. C Bray, postmaster.

BREADALBANE. A country post office in Lochiel township, Glengarry County, 35 miles north of Cornwall, the county seat, and 15 north of Alexandria, on the C A Ry, the nearest railway and banking point. It is on the daily stage route from Alexandria to Vankleek Hill. Population, 50. Mail daily. John R Campbell, postmaster.

BRECHIN. A village in Mara township, Ontario County, 50 miles north of Whitby, the county seat, and 1 from Brechin station, on the M div G T Ry. Orillia 13 miles north-west is the nearest banking point. It contains Catholic and Methodist churches and public and separate schools, and ships grain and live stock. Population, 200. Telegraph, GNW. Express, Canadian. Mail daily. J J Bernard, postmaster.
