Includes that of LORD CHANCELLOR TALBOT appended to ancient deed on vellum, relating to the bankruptcy of one JOHN HENRY, of Chelmsford, Kent, dated 16 July, 1735, with portrait. LORD CHANCELLOR COWPER, an aut. l., signed Dec. 16, 170, with a portrait. LORD CHANCELLOR KING, an ancient folio deed, on vellum, signed 1st June, 1728, with portrait. LORD CHANCELLOR HARDWICKE, an ancient document on vellum, 19 March, 1745, with portrait. *This being the well known PHILIP YORK, who was one of the most upright of men and ablest of lawyers.* LORD CHANCELLOR ELDON, a document on bankruptcy, on vellum, signed 23 January, 1802. A. WEDDERBURN, after Earl Rosslyn, Lord Chancellor, a signed deliverance on some naval dispute, Lincoln's Inn, May 22, 1763. LORD KENYON, portrait with aut. affixed and date 9 Feb. 1784. LORD CHANCELLOR THURLOW, portrait with a signed epistle affixed. SIR E. B. SUGDEN, portrait and a franked envelope bearing date, 1830. ROBERT HARLEY, EARL OF OXFORD, portrait and a printed order respecting the repayment of a loan on Malt, 1712 and 13. A portion of an ancient Document signed by POULEY, R. O. HARLEY, J. PAGETT, dated 13 January, 1712. ROBERT WALPOLE, Earl of Oxford, portrait, also a portion of an ancient document signed by R. WALPOLE, the EARL OF ONSLOW and others, dated 1722. THE EARL OF ABERCROMBY, portrait and autograph on franked address. THOS. PELHAM, DUKE OF NEWCASTLE, portrait and aut. letter to Lord Chancellor King, dated Hampton Court, 1731. SHELBORNE, LORD, an aut. letter signed, dated from Whitehall, April 4, 1767, which must have brought relief to one poor wretch as follows: Sir, "I am commanded to signify to you His Majesty's pleasure that the execution of the sentence of death passed upon ISABELLA CONNICK at the last Assizes held for the county of Lancashire, for forging the will of John Watson, be respited till further order, I am, etc., SHELBURNE. To the High Sheriff of the County of Lancaster. A franked envelope of the DUKE OF PORTLAND, 1801, his signature also on a letter, 1799. SPENCER WALPOLE, 1848, and LORD MELBOURNE, 1838. PORTRAIT and AUTOGRAPH of WILLIAM 4th, a folio sheet of foolscap, containing "The Word for November, 1821," signed by the DUKE OF WELLINGTON and others. A Concession, signed by GEORGE R. (Geo. IV.) and LORD SIDMOUTH, with portraits, a folio form, signed by LORD DERBY, appointing Thomas Putler to be an Ensign, with a seal, 1804. Further on will be seen another document signed by LORD DERBY appointing this same man to be an officer in the Liverpool Custom House Volunteers. A vellum document appointing E. Dalton as a Lieutenant, signed by WILLIAM THE 4th, with stamp, etc., and a portrait. A letter of thanks dated 18 April, 1818, Kensington Palace, and signed by EDWARD DUKE OF KENT, with portraits of the Duke and Duchess, PORTRAIT of THE QUEEN, 1837, also an envelope with a broad black border, addressed to SIR HENRY PONSONBY, K. C. B., and signed in the corner V. R. A War Office Circular, signed by LORD PALMERSTON, 8th Jan. 1810, also a portrait and a franked envelope dated from Romney, 1821, and signed PALMERSTON. A Precept for wages for the Home Department, signed by ROBERT PEEL, 1823. A Franked Envelope addressed to COL. YATES, from SIR ROBERT PEEL, also a portrait will be found further on. Aut. of the RT. HON. FOX MAULE on a franked envelope, 1835, beneath a portrait. Aut. on an envelope of LORD JOHN RUSSELL. A South Australian Emigration Circular, 1839, bears the signature of ROWLAND HILL. A franked envelope signed by, and with a portrait of LORD GRENVILLE, 1830. Portrait of GEO. CANNING with a portion of an old letter containing his autograph. Woodcut portrait of the PRINCE OF WALES, also of PRINCE ARTHUR, with the autograph of each appended. Of JUSTICE HANNEN, with autograph, 1888. Of SIR JOHN BOWRING, with aut. on a franked envelope. Of DR. LYON PLAYFAIR, with autograph of MR. GLADSTONE and LORD SALSBURY, each with autograph. Of EARL SPENCER when Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, with a franked envelope dated 1873. Of MILNER GIBSON, with autograph. An autograph letter addressed to MR. EDWARD LLOYD by the GREAT DUKE OF LEINSTER, 1862. Of LORD SHAFTSBURY, the philanthropist.
