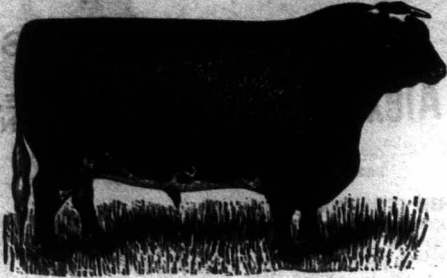

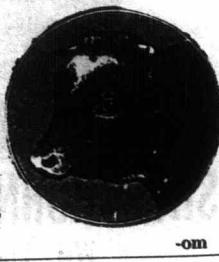

GOSSIP.

George Isaac, Bonanton, Ont., advertises seven imported Clydesdale stallions, two of which were winners at the Royal Northern Show.

At the sale of Nichols & Gibson's offering of Shorthorns, at West Liberty, Iowa, March 7th, 46 head averaged \$254. The roan bull calf, Iowa Champion, was bought by Geo. Harding & Son, Waukesha, Wis., at \$700. His dam, Gipsy Maid, sold for \$300 to C. B. Dustin, Summer Hill, Ill.

Hereford cattle registration goes on at a rapid rate. The book also contains illustrations of a number of prominent representatives of the breed, sketched by the celebrated artists, Lou Burke and Cecil Palmer. THE HARDY GALLOWAY.

Mr. D. McCrae, Guelph, recently sold to Mr. John Sibbald, of Annapolis, Ont., his fine old Galloway bull, of Adrian Borderer, the champion of many a showing. The train on which the bull was shipped left the track on the edge of a bridge 65 feet high near Fergus, and ten of the cars, including the one in which was the old bull, went down to the ice in the river below, and were smashed to pieces so completely that the train hands fired the debris, but his bullock was seen making a bee line for his old home. He was corralled and taken back to Fergus, not much worse for his exciting experience, and loaded again, reaching Owen Sound in the evening and walking out to Mr. Sibbald's farm, 4 miles distant, next day. A hog, which went down in the same wreck, was found busily eating meal out of a bag when the trainmen reached the scene.

HIGH-PRICED HEREFORDS.

The Hereford men in the West are having a high time. At the sale of a draft from the Weavergrace herd of T. F. B. Sotham, of Chilli-cothe, Mo., held at Kansas City, March 1st, the 4-year-old bull Sir Bredwell, winner of the championship of the breed at the Trans-Mississippi Exhibition at Omaha last year, made the record price for a Hereford bull at public sale in America of \$5,000, the purchaser being Col. C. C. Slaughter, Dallas, Texas. Twenty-four bulls at this sale averaged \$399.40; 22 females, \$125.25 each; and 46 head in all averaged \$516.10.

At Mr. F. A. Nave's sale in the same series the following day, the 3-year-old bull Gold Dollar sold for \$870, and the 2-year-old heifer Arnel for \$1,075. The average for 30 females at this sale was \$430.85; for 19 bulls, \$307.20; and for 49 head, \$333 each.

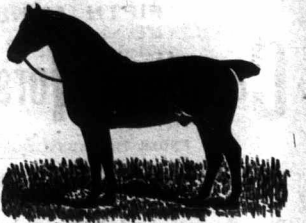
The third day's sale was that of Grant Hornaby, of Fort Scott, Kansas, at which the 3-year-old bull Sir Comewell brought \$1,600; the 4-year-old cow Bonny Maid, \$825; and 38 head an average of \$350.
