MR. HEARD AND THE UNION BANK. -The last number of the Herald has a long communicated article in reference to the Supreme Court-Heard v the Union Bank-defining the duties of the directors and eulogising the conduct of the Bank generally. To this of course we have no objection; but there is one feature of the case to which we call special attention. It is this: An impression has gone abroad that in the complications which arose some years ago in this Bank. Mr. Heard was in some way dishonorably connected. In case any person unacquainted with Mr. Heard may have given credence to the reports put in circulation we may state that during the searching investigation, which lasted for six days, not one single fact was discovered which could in any way injure Mr. Heard's character as an honest and upright man. On the contrary, the evidence of several of the Directors went to show that the Bank had not the slightest suspicion of Mr. Heard's integrity. Heren the Judge, in On FRIDAY, August 10th, his charge to the jury said he wished it distinctly to go forth that Mr. Heard came out of this business as he always did when he appeared before the Court, with a clean record.—Argus, Charlottetown, P.E.I.
