CHAP. XXVIII.

An Act respecting the establishment of Provinces in the Dominion of Canada.

[29th June, 1871.]

THEREAS doubts have been entertained respecting the powers of the Parliament of Canada to establish Provinces in Territories admitted, or which may hereafter be admitted into the Dominion of Canada, and to provide for the representation of such Provinces in the said Parliament, and it is expedient to remove such doubts, and to vest such powers in the

Be it enacted by the Queen's most excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited for all purposes as "The British Short title.

"North America Act, 1871."

2. The Parliament of Canada may from time to time establish Parliament of new Provinces in any territories forming for the time being part Canada may of the Dominion of Canada but not included in the Borning of Canada but not incl of the Dominion of Canada, but not included in any Province Povinces and thereof, and may, at the time of such establishment, make provision for the constitution and eliminate of such establishment, make proviconstitution, sion for the constitution and administration of any such Province, &c., thereof. and for the passing of laws for the peace, order, and good government of such Province, and for its representation in the said Parliament.

3. The Parliament of Canada may from time to time, with the Alteration of limits of Proconsent of the Legislature of any Province of the said Dominion, vinces. increase, diminish, or otherwise alter the limits of such Province, upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed to by the said Legislature, and may, with the like consent, make provision respecting the effect and operation of any such increase or diminution or alteration of territory in relation to any Province affected thereby.
