The circular announcing the annual meeting of the Dominion Alliance thus summarizes the temperance work done by the Ontario Legislature at its last session: (1) The prohibition of the sale of liquor to all persons under eighteen years of age. (2) The prohibition of liquor-selling in clubs incorporated under the general act or unincorporated. (3) The making of hotel-keepers who sell their bars responsible to any illegal selling in such bars. (4) The requiring an applicant for a new license to secure a petition for such license from a majority of the electors in his polling subdivision. (5) The absolute prohibition of liquor-selling in any municipality to prohibit entirely the sale of liquor within the limits of such municipality. These reforms, it says, are now doing effective work in the curbing of the evils of intemperance, and under the last mentioned provision "very active and aggressive campaigning is now going on in different parts of the Province."
